CSU Campus Connections Mentoring Program serves youth ranging in age from 11-18 who are referred from community partners within the juvenile justice system of Larimer County, local schools, community agencies, and families. Youth spend four hours once a week with a trained undergraduate mentor in a group setting to provide academic support and career planning, encourage positive social skills development, assist with goal setting, and implement wellness programming. Strong bonds are developed over the 12 week program between mentors and mentees. Graduate students and experienced mentors serve as mentor coaches to provide therapeutic support and guidance during Campus Connections meetings.
